Local Task Force History

The Right to Education Local Task Force, otherwise known as LTF, was established in 1972 due to the PARC Consent Decree.

The PARC Consent Decree was created after the PA Association for Retarded Citizens, now the ARC of PA, sued the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania for the rights of children with intellectual and developmental disabilities to attend public school.

The state of Pennsylvania agreed to provide a Free and Appropriate Public Education, otherwise known as FAPE, for all children with disabilities.

The Court's decree established the standard that each child must be offered an Individualized Education Program (IEP) and that children should be placed in the Least Restrictive Environment (LRE) possible while promoting inclusion.

The PARC consent decree was then recognized on a national level as the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act, also known as IDEA, in 1975.

<u>Membership:</u>

The Local Task Force 21 members are families of children with disabilities otherwise known as consumers. In addition to families, each LTF must have representatives from: The CLIU 21 (Director or designee) The ARC of PA (Advocates or designee), and Service Providers serving school-aged, special needs children.
